College & Scholarship Binder

There is a black binder on Mrs. Rohrig's desk that we need to have completed by every senior with their college decisions and scholarship information. This needs to be completed no later than **April 23rd**. This needs to be completed in order to accurately send final transcripts and scholarship money. This information is also used for the senior awards ceremony and graduation.

Senior Seminar- Rescheduled

We will have a senior seminar on **January 28th** during X-hour in the Great Hall. Seniors will be starting the CFOV Scholarship application. Seniors must bring their Chromebook.

WV Promise Application

Mrs. Blake and Mrs. Rohrig will be going into senior religion classes **February 6th and 7th** to help students apply for the WV Promise. We require all WV residents to apply. Grade Report forms will come home closer to this date for parents to sign.

FAFSA

FAFSA is now available. Remember that students and parent(s) must create an FSA ID and password prior to completing the FAFSA, it is recommended to do this 3-5 days before. To create your FSA ID and password [click here](#). To file your FAFSA [click here](#), make sure to select the 2025-2026 FAFSA Form. Please keep in mind that in order to qualify for many scholarships, students **MUST** have submitted a FAFSA by **March 1st**.

CFOV Scholarship Application

The Community Foundation of the Ohio Valley (CFOV) scholarship application is now open! These scholarships are just for students from the Ohio Valley and there are quite a few just for CCHS seniors! Mrs.

Blake and I strongly recommend starting the main application early because some of the scholarships require an additional application or documentation to be submitted. Please do not wait until the last minute, the quality of the application, essay, or recommendation may suffer if you put it off. The deadline to apply is **Feb. 28th at 4:00 PM**, this is a hard deadline, and no late application will be accepted.

Ohio University and Ohio University Eastern

Did you know, Ohio University and Ohio University Eastern Campus offer tuition reciprocity for West Virginia Residents. Thinking about applying? Use one of the application waiver codes below to waive the application fee:

OHIO Athens: havertyapply

OHIO Eastern: Eastern2025

Please make sure to apply before the scholarship deadline of **February 1st** for Ohio University Main Campus and **February 15th** for Ohio University Eastern.

AP Fees

- All students enrolled in an AP course are required to take the AP exam in May
- All exam fees are determined by the College Board (the company in which AP courses are governed)
- AP students are responsible for providing the full amount of required test fees UNLESS the student qualifies for free/reduced lunch (Those who qualify have received an email from Mrs. Blake indicating the reduced rate)
- Monthly payments will be accepted
- Exam fee balance must be paid in full by **March 1, 2025**
- Cash, Check (made payable to CCHS) or Credit Card (must provide over the phone directly to Mrs. LeAnn Harris: 304-905-6242) are acceptable forms of payment
- Send payment to school to the attention of Mrs. Erika Rohrig
- Exam fee is \$99 PER EXAM
- An additional \$40 fee will automatically apply (per College Board) if a student drops an AP course after November 15, 2024

Letters of Recommendation

Seniors should have already requested at a minimum of two letters of recommendation at this point in the academic year. If not, they are strongly encouraged to do so now. Please have your recommender email a copy to Mrs. Rohrig (erohrig@cchsknights.org), you will likely need to use the letter more than once and this way she will have it readily available for you.

Transcript Requests

As soon as a student applies to any college they must, email Mrs. Rohrig (erohrig@cchsknights.org) and request that the transcript be sent. Please let her know the college and how it needs to be submitted. We must have a written request to release the transcript. If a student applies to any college via Common App, their transcript will automatically include the transcript that was uploaded by whoever they list as the counselor (Mrs. Blake or Mrs. Rohrig).

College Acceptance & Scholarship Letters

As you are all starting the college application process, Mrs. Rohrig will be tracking the colleges where you have been accepted, and all your scholarship offers. Please email her the following:

1. A list of all the colleges you have been accepted to. We will compile a list of all the colleges that you have been accepted to for the graduation program. You can bring your acceptance letter in or email me a picture.
2. Any scholarship offer you receive. We love to brag about our seniors and all the hard work you have put in! We track the total amount of scholarships earned by the Class of 2025! I will need the offers from all the colleges you have been accepted to, even if you are not attending that school.
3. A copy of scholarship awards (especially any awards that were independently sought) must also be submitted in order to announce them at our Senior Awards Ceremony in May.

We are proud to share our students' many achievements, but we must have copies of all scholarship awards by May 1, 2025, to publish and announce on **May 21st**.

CCHS Legacy Information

If you would like your family's legacy information listed in our 2025 Commencement booklet and Annual Magazine, you must complete this form no later than **January 31st**. We only need the number of family members & their relationship to your CCHS senior who have graduated from **any of the following**: CCHS, St. Joseph's Academy or Bishop Donahue High School.

Important WVU Information

Seniors applying to WVU please read these important changes and reminders.

Important Changes Related to Transcripts and Test Score

- Self-reported courses and grades on both the [Common Application](#) and [our application](#) are no longer accepted.
- Applicants may submit a PDF copy of the unofficial transcript for decision processing to scanning@mail.wvu.edu. An official copy must follow prior to enrollment. Email Mrs. Rohrig and she will send your official transcripts.
- Self-reported test scores on the Common Application are not accepted, and we will not accept scores listed on the high school transcript.
- Scores must be sent directly from the testing agency.
 - WVU's SAT school code is: **5904**.
 - ACT school code is: **4540**.

Scholarship and Honors College Reminders

- Students are automatically considered for our [merit scholarships](#) when they apply for admission.
- Three scholarships, [Diversity](#), [Leadership](#), and [University Merit](#) have different requirements and require separate applications.
- Certain [academic department scholarships](#) require separate applications.
- The [Promise Scholarship](#) requires a separate application and completion of the FAFSA.

- Students are automatically considered for the [Honors College](#) when they apply for admission. Consideration for Honors will open in mid-fall.

Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholars Program

West Virginia's newest, most prestigious scholarship – the Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholars Program – helps recent high school graduates pursue rewarding careers as WV teachers in math, science, elementary education or special education.

Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholars can receive up to \$10,000 per year to pay for eligible college expenses, including tuition and fees, room and board, and textbooks.

Even better, you will be paired up with a practicing teacher in your chosen field who will be available from the beginning to help you navigate the college process and become one of West Virginia's most talented new teachers.

You may apply to become an Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholar if you meet the following minimum requirements.

- High school senior or recent high school graduate with plans to pursue a bachelor's degree in an approved teacher preparation program in math, science, elementary education or special education at an eligible West Virginia institution;
- Has never been enrolled as a degree-seeking student at college or university;
- Achieved a cumulative high school grade point average of at least 3.25 on 4.0 scale, or an equivalent grade point average based on an individual school district's grading policy;
- Earned minimum ACT scores of 21 in math and 18 in English, or minimum SAT scores of 530 in math and 480 in English;
- Must be a United States citizen or hold a valid Employment Authorization Document (EAD), or work permit, issued by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) office; and
- Willing to teach in a West Virginia public school for five years after college graduation in the fields of math, science, elementary education, or special education. Applicants are NOT required to be residents of the state of West Virginia; and
- Must be willing to attend the award banquet and Student Success Summit event in Charleston, WV, in late July. Lodging costs will be paid by the Higher Education Policy Commission for Underwood-Smith Teaching Scholars.

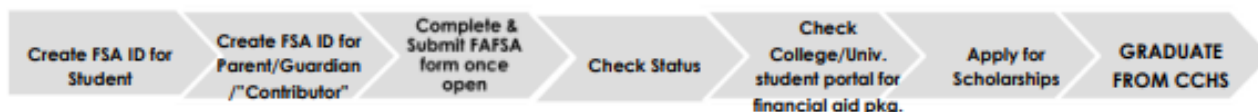

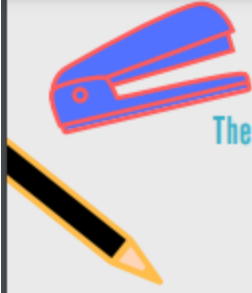

If for some reason, you are NOT successfully linked to the IRS portal, then you will be required to enter your 2023 tax return information (which is why we suggest you gather that info. prior to the start of the form). Also note that most questions offer a  button just to the right of the question. <input type="checkbox"/>	1-3 Business Days Following Submission of the FAFSA	<p>Students and/or Parent(s) should log back into their respective accounts to check the status of processing. Draft: Your section of the FAFSA form is incomplete. In Progress: You provided your consent, approval, and signature to your section of the FAFSA form, but the FAFSA form has not been submitted yet. In Review: The FAFSA form was submitted but hasn't been processed yet. Action Required: You are missing your consent and approval or signature or the FAFSA form was processed by a correction is required. Processed: Your application was processed successfully. No further action is needed. Closed: Your FAFSA form was never submitted and can no longer be submitted because the federal FAFSA deadline passed.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Once FAFSA is Processed	<p>Student will get a FAFSA Submission Summary after your FAFSA form is processed (via email or it can be accessed through your student.aid.gov account dashboard under "My Activity"). Look over this summary carefully and make sure you didn't make a mistake on your FAFSA form and make corrections to your FAFSA data if necessary. <input type="checkbox"/>	Once FAFSA is Processed (Continued)	<p>FAFSA information will be sent directly to schools that were listed by student when submitting the FAFSA. Those schools will then prepare financial aid packages which will be made available to students through their college/university/school student portals. Students must access this information through this means or by contacting the college/university/school financial aid office directly. Any changes to personal or financial circumstances that could not be reported on the FAFSA at the time of completion must be communicated directly to the respective college/university/school financial aid office NOT CCHS.</p>
